

CADBURY AT LEWES
AFTERNOON EXCHANGE
October 15, 2009

Vic Amey, President & CEO, welcomed residents to the “Afternoon Exchange” forum.

Chuck Rendulic, Director of Support Services, stated that if residents should have any difficulties with their heating system this season, to please call the maintenance department at extension 6388. If a resident should need immediate assistance for their heating system after hours or on weekends, the front desk should be called so the emergency contractor can be notified. Chuck reminded residents that only food scraps should be placed in a garbage disposal. In the next week the wells for the irrigation system will be placed on the campus. Landscaping will be placed around the wells after the installation of the wells has been completed. Window washing, which began this week, will be continued into next week.

Vic introduced Ann Murray who oversees Cadbury’s rehabilitation program and is a manager with the provider of this department, Sundance Rehabilitation Corporation. She noted that Sundance provides Cadbury four physical therapists, three occupational therapists and one fulltime speech therapist. If a resident wishes to inquire about rehab services, they may call 302-644-6390.

Vic shared notes from Carol Holzman, Director of Residential Services, who was attending a conference in Chicago. If a resident wishes to meet with Carol it would be helpful if the resident called her to make an appointment (302-644-6374). Residents need to dispose of kitty litter in the proper manner and not to deposit it in the retention ponds. Also, all recyclable material should be placed in plastic bags and not just thrown loose into the recycling containers. Cadbury raised \$832 for the American Heart Association Heart Walk held recently in Georgetown. Residents were reminded to register for the Alzheimer’s caregivers support seminar to be held on October 22 in the Cadbury auditorium. On October 23 at 1:00 p.m. in the Cadbury auditorium there will be a performance by Opera Delaware. If there is enough interest, there will be a bus trip to the Philadelphia Craft Show on November 13 where tickets can be purchased at the door. Vic reminded residents that occasionally there are glitches in communications regarding events and staff does try very hard to publish any changes in the calendar as far in advance as possible. Vic reminded residents that for scheduled trips on the Cadbury bus there needs to be five or more residents signed-up for a trip and, if not, the trip will be cancelled.

Vic noted that Cadbury at Lewes was not officially taking a position regarding the proposed Townsend Village Centre to be located across from the Cape Henlopen High School on Kings Highway. As background information, Vic stated that Cadbury would not have been built without the generosity and support of LT Associates who previously owned the land on which Cadbury is built. LT Associates worked with Cadbury in many ways in an effort to demonstrate to the community at large their support for including organizations that serve the public interest. Vic, again, stated that Cadbury was not

taking a public position on the matter but believed the background information would be of interest to residents.

It was noted that the budget process for the next fiscal year will begin later this month and Vic had asked Barbara Cleaveland, chair of CALRA, to recruit ten residents who would be interested in serving on a resident budget committee.

It was reported that the area where the Delaware Electric Cooperative's meters are installed and where the controls for the irrigation wells are also installed will have shrubbery planted around them to camouflage this equipment.

Vic reported that Ingrid Dellatorre, Dining Services Manager, had asked him to express her appreciation that residents are fully cooperating with the fact that the Bistro operates in the cafeteria style and does not offer waited service.
