

**CADBURY AT LEWES
AFTERNOON EXCHANGE
July 2, 2009**

Vic Amey, President & CEO, welcomed residents to the “Afternoon Exchange” forum. Vic introduced Thom Morris, Chair of the Cadbury at Lewes Board of Directors. Residents were reminded of the July 4 barbecue to be held on the patio adjacent to the dining room.

Carol Holzman, Director of Residential Services, reminded residents to return the authorization forms regarding permission for relatives and friends to enter a resident’s unit when the resident is not able to be in his/her unit. Residents were reminded to please not park in the fire lane on the circle at the main entrance to Cadbury as this is where an ambulance or other emergency vehicle would park. Monthly activity calendars are disappearing from the resident mailboxes. If you need more than one calendar, extras are available. Residents were reminded to be conservative with their individual air conditioning units and not to have their hall doors open when using the air conditioner.

Lynette Palen, Executive Director of Development, stated that the Development Committee was holding its first event at the “Fish On” restaurant in Lewes on July 8. Monies raised from this event will go toward the Health Center Patio Fund.

Chuck Rendulic, Director of Support Services, stated that Comcast continues to work on providing boxes to Cadbury residents. It was stated that the annual fire inspection and fire drills will be held in August. Maintenance staff continue to work through the porch cleanings.

Vic reported that Cadbury Continuing Care at Home is in its 11th year. This is a service provided to seniors in the greater community who need some assistance but do not want to leave their homes. Cadbury Continuing Care at Home is a subsidiary of Cadbury Senior Services and utilizes the expertise and many of the services provided by Cadbury at Cherry Hill. It is hoped that, in the future, this service can be brought to Cadbury at Lewes. Vic stated that he had just signed a development agreement with a retirement community in New Hampshire to provide consulting support for this community to set up its own at home services. This will extend Cadbury’s mission and provide financial viability to the organization.

Vic then reviewed the PMIs (“Please Mention It” forms) that he received since the last Afternoon Exchange meeting:

- Crooked trees on the campus will be straightened.
- Weeds growing in the cracks of the sidewalks will be sprayed.
- The staff will be instructed to turn off the ventilation system in the dining room for dinner when necessary.

- Deflectors in the living room will be turned down.

There will be no Afternoon Exchange in August. The next Afternoon Exchange will be held on Wednesday, September 23 at 4:00 p.m.
