

MINUTES
CADBURY AT LEWES RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION
GENERAL MEETING
Monday, May 20, 2013; 10:00 am in the Auditorium

Tom Lord presented the Program entitled "Native Plants around Cadbury."

President Adele Hudson Trout called the meeting to order. A moment of silence was observed. There were 61 members present.

MINUTES: The minutes of the April 8, 2013 Board of Directors' Meeting and the April 15, 2013 General Meeting were accepted as posted with a noted correction.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: Binky Tompkins reported that she sent two cards.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Gil Kaufman reported that the balance as of April 8, 2013 was \$7,940. Income was \$564 and expenses were \$346, leaving a balance of \$8,158. Of that, the Employee Appreciation Carryover is \$257, so the actual balance as of May 13, 2013 is \$7,901.

ASSISTANT TREASURER'S REPORT: Diantha Pack reported that 102 individuals contributed \$2,398 to CALRA.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Activities: Don Burgess reported that the following activities are coming up this month:

- May 21st – Ladies lunch at Rose and Crown,
 - May 22nd – Water Taxi Ride and lunch at Paradise Grill departing from Long Neck Road, and
 - May 29th – Dover Downs and Mall.
- Trips in June may include:
- June 4th - Summer Concerts in Stango Park will resume on Tuesdays at 7 pm,
 - June 5th - Fenwick Island's Seaside Country Store with lunch at Harpoon Hannah's,
 - June 11th - Alpaca farm in Greenwood,
 - June 19th – Georgetown Airport and lunch,
 - A tour with Russ McCabe, and
 - June 21st - Ice Cream Social with "Elaines."
 - A visit to the 15th Annual Chautauqua event in Lewes is being planned.
 - Visits will be made to the Lewes and Rehoboth Beach Farmers' Markets.

Dining: Bill Peterson reported that:

- Food services was \$30,000 over budget last year.
 - The Bistro serves more meals per day than the Chart Room—more than 50.
 - The Bistro was not intended to serve dinners and the practice interferes with service to the Chart Room.
- Around July 1, the following will take effect:
- Only two of four entrees will be available in the Bistro.
 - The Cost will remain at \$7.
 - Orders phoned in before 4:30 can be for all four entrees, and there may be other adjustments.
 - The new menus will include more vegetarian items.
 - Upgrade items will not be available in the Bistro.
 - New policies will be officially announced by notice in our mailboxes.

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Things to think about regarding dining services:

- Original contracts called for 15 dinners per month—period. The change to \$150 Cadbury Cash per month allowed more leeway in food choices.
- Most CCRCs will not serve dinners out of the Bistro; most CCRCs will not let residents use dinner credits in the Bistro.
- Your CALRA Dining Committee is an advisory group only and has no power or authority to change anything—can only offer suggestions.

Gift Shop: Jack Sparks reported that the income for April 2013 was \$369 and expenses were \$49. The total net profit as of May 13, 2013 is \$320. The total profit for the year is \$1,087. Residents were thanked for their contributions and their help in running the Shop.

Newsletter: Pat O’Hanlon reported that the next edition will be out in late May.

Program: Jane Lord, for Nancy Krail, reported the following short program:

- June 17th – Volunteer Opportunities at Cadbury. The long programs will be as follows:
- May 21st – Stephen Van Dyke, Smithsonian, “Treasures of the National Design Museum Library” with coffee and sweets from 7 to 7:30 thanks to Karen Consolini.
- June 18th – Kalmar Nickel Foundation program.
- There will be no program in July but in August there will be another Movie-Talk-a-thon. Carol Bishop announced the Spring Concert by the Cadbury Chorus which will be held June 25th in the auditorium. This concert will include excerpts by voice students of our Director, Jerry Birl, in between choral selections.

Woodworking: Dean Hoover is working on some unique clocks, bowls, and tables. Ron is working on four new bird houses. All receipts for sales of his work are donated to the Cadbury at Lewes Foundation. Both men make repairs for residents when requested.

OLD BUSINESS: The front desk has requested that residents flatten boxes before discarding them. They also reminded residents who sign out (leaving campus) remember to sign in when they return.

NEW BUSINESS: Adele Trout reported that Dick Cleaveland is in the process of having pictures taken for the new pictorial directory. Also, Tom Olsen said we need to improve our sound system.
